## S.T. Fearless

S.T. Fearless was a working steam tug. It was built in Canada during World War II. Tugs are the workhorses of any Port. Their job is to come alongside ships and push and nudge the ships to berth at the wharf. In the tug's latter days it worked on the Brisbane River. Many people worked together to float it ashore.





#### **Old Wool Stores**

Alexander Lang Elder built these buildings to store wool. The wool was sold at auction and sent to England.



**Old Customs House** 

The old customs house was built in 1879.

Customs are responsible for checking that the goods brought into Australia are safe and legal.



### **Harts Mill**

This is the old flour mill built by Captain John Hart. It opened in 1855 and employed 30 workers, many of whom were Aboriginal.

This was used in Port
Adelaide to direct
traffic before traffic
lights.







## **Bridges**

- 1. The Birkenhead Bridge is a double-leaf bascule drawbridge. Opened in 1940.
